Requirements



All middle school students are strongly encouraged to read a chapter book during the summer which follows the minimum page requirement.

- Incoming 6th graders:
150 pg. minimum
- Incoming 7th graders:
175 pg. minimum
- Incoming 8th graders:
200 pg. minimum
- Students should choose a book they have never read before.
- Prior to returning to school in August, students should complete a "Summer Book Review." Students have been given a copy of this paper, but it is also located on the Eagle View webpage.

Why should I participate in the Summer Reading?

- Greater participation opportunities during "Celebrate Reading Day"
- Get an early start on PA Young Reader's Choice Program
- Increase vocabulary
- Improve writing skills
- Improve concentration and focus
- Learn more about other people and cultures
- Self-improvement in many other areas

When do I turn in my "Summer Book Review" and who will be collecting it?

Be prepared with your paper the first day of school. You will be handing it in to your language arts teacher.
